

RESOLUTION NO. 189

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO CLOSE UP AND VACATE A PORTION OF "COUNTRY CLUB DRIVE" IN THE CITY OF CHULA VISTA, COUNTY OF SAN DIEGO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, WHICH SAID PORTION THEREOF IS IN THE BODY OF THIS RESOLUTION PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED, SAID "COUNTRY CLUB DRIVE" BEING A STREET IN SAID CITY OF CHULA VISTA.

RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of the City of Chula Vista, in the County of San Diego, State of California, that the public interest and convenience requires the following public work to be done in said City, and therefore the Board of Trustees of said City hereby declares its intention to order the following described public work in said City, to wit: *The closing up and vacating*

All that portion of "Country Club Drive", in the City of Chula Vista, County of San Diego, State of California, described as follows, to wit: Beginning at a point where the center line of L Street intersects the westerly line of "Country Club Drive"; thence South $4^{\circ} 54'$ East along said westerly line 41.13 feet to the southerly line of L Street; thence North $71^{\circ} 38'$ East along said southerly line of L Street 90.0 feet; thence North $81^{\circ} 55'$ West 89.82 feet to the place of beginning; being a triangular piece of land situate on the northerly side of Lot 19, Quarter Section 121 of Chula Vista, California, according to map thereof, number 505 filed in the office of the County Recorder of said San Diego County, March, 13th, 1888. That the land deemed necessary to be taken for said public work are none and the closing up and vacating of said public street constitute such public work.

~~are the exterior boundaries of the corporate limits of the said City of Chula Vista.~~

~~That no lands are to be assessed to pay the damages, costs and expenses thereof and that no assessment for said work is necessary.~~

The Street Superintendent of said City is hereby directed to cause to be conspicuously posted along the line of said contemplated work and improvement, at not more than three hundred feet in distance apart, but not less than three in all, notices of the passage of this Resolution. Each of said notices shall be headed "Notice of Public Work" in letters not less than one inch in length, and shall in legible letters state the fact of the passage of this Resolution, its date, and briefly the work and

improvement proposed, and shall refer to this Resolution for further particulars, and to cause a notice similar in substance to be published by four successive insertions in the Chula Vista Star, a weekly newspaper published and circulated in said City, and of general circulation, there being no daily newspaper published and circulated in said City, and said Chula Vista Star is hereby designated as the newspaper in which said publication shall be made; and said Street Superintendent shall make and file in the office of the City Clerk of said City any and all necessary affidavits showing the posting and publishing of said notices of public work and improvement.

That in case there are objections made to said proposed work and improvement in the way and manner provided by law, the City Clerk of said City shall notify the proper persons making such objections in the way and manner provided by law; and said proposed work and improvement is to be done under and pursuant to Chapter LXXVI of the Laws of 1889 of the State of California and amendments if any thereto.

The exterior boundaries of the district of lands to be effected or benefited by the closing up and vacating of ^{said} portion of said "Country Club Drive" are described as follows:

and are ^{partly said} in the City of Chula Vista, ^{and all in the} County of San Diego, State of California, All that portion of the South Half of L Street, between the West line of Sixth Avenue and the Westerly line of Country Club Drive, lying North of a line beginning at a point where the center line of L Street intersects the Westerly line of Country Club Drive; thence South $81^{\circ} 55'$ East 89.82 feet, also all that portion of Lot 19 in Quarter Section 121 of Chula Vista, California, according to map thereof No. 505 filed in the office of the County Recorder of said San Diego County, March, 13th, 1888 described as follows: Beginning at the intersection of the center line of L Street and the Westerly line of Country Club Drive; thence South $71^{\circ} 38'$ West along the Northerly line of said Lot 19, 407.65 feet to the Northwest corner, ^{of said Lot 19} thence South $18^{\circ} 22'$ East along the Westerly line of said Lot 19, 330 feet to the Southwest corner, ^{of said Lot 19} thence North $71^{\circ} 38'$ East along the Southerly line of said Lot 19, 488.07 feet to a point; thence North

18° 22' West parallel to the Westerly line of said Lot 19, 290 feet; thence South 71° 38' West along the Southerly line of L Street 90 feet; thence North 4° 54' West along the Westerly line of said Country Club Drive 41.13 feet to the place of beginning.
