RESOLUTION No. 357

WHEREAS, HUGH C. GLASGOW, a highly honored and respected resident of The City of Chula Vista, California, now deceased, did by his last will and testament and the codicil thereto, give, devise and bequeath unto The City of Chula Vista, California, the five-acre tract of land, together with the house and buildings thereon, located at the Cornor of Fourth and F Streets within The City of Chula Vista, the house thereon being known as #168 F Street, Chula Vista, California, only on the following conditions: That the said tract of land and property shall be used only and exclusively as and for a public park, which said property and park shall be designated and shall always be known as "GLASGOW PARK"; it being also the desire of the said testator that the residence building located on said property in which he was at the time of making his will residing shall be kept in repair out of the proceeds of his trust fund created in said will and codicil thereto and that said building be maintained and used so long as it is possible to do so in connection with said property, and

WHEREAS, The City of Chula Vista, California, is required to accept said gift of property in order to obtain it,

NOW, THEREFORE, the said City of Chula Vista does hereby signify its appreciation and acceptance of the said gift and any other property given to it by the said will or codicil thereto and agrees to abide by the request of the said testator and to comply with the provisions of said will and the codicil thereto concerning the said gift of property, and does here and now name the said property "GLASGOW PARK" and call upon all its residents and the citizens of Chula Vista and the public in general to speak of said property and park only as the "GLASGOW PARK", in honor and memory of the said testator.

The City Attorney and the City Clerk of the City of Chula Vista, California, are authorized to use this Resolution in any manner necessary to the end that the City of Chula Vista may obtain title to the said property and use the same for the purposes for which the gift was made by the testator.

The City Attorney is further authorized to represent the City of Chula Vista, California, in any probate proceedings or other actions involving the said last will and testament or the codicil thereto or the estate of the said deceased.

Passed, adopted and approved by the City Council of the City of Chula Vista, California, in regular session, this Second day of January, A. D. 1934, by the following vote:
