

RESOLUTION No. 374, OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHULA VISTA, CALIFORNIA.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Chula Vista, California, having received an official notice that the United States Government has allocated to the said city, the sum of One Hundred and Forty-one Thousand, Eight Hundred Dollars, (\$141,800.00) for the purpose of paving certain streets in the said city, the work to be performed under the Government Public Works Administration, and

WHEREAS, it will be necessary for the said City of Chula to hold a special election for the purpose of voting on the question of whether or not the said city will issue bonds in the said amount of \$141,800.00, and

WHEREAS, the firm of O'Melveny, Tuller and Myers, Attorneys at Law, located at 435 South Spring Street, in Los Angeles, California, has made an offer to the said city, to furnish all legal papers, all legal work in connection with holding the said special election, above mentioned, and furnish a legal opinion on the legality of the bonds, if such bonds are authorized at the said election, at the following charges for such services, to-wit: Four Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$450.00) if the said election authorizes the issue of the said bonds; Two Hundred and Twenty-five Dollars (\$225.00) if the said election fails to authorize the issue of said bonds; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Chula Vista, California, accepts the above set forth offer of the said firm of attorneys at law, and instructs the said firm to proceed with the work of calling a special election.
