

RESOLUTION No. 376

WHEREAS, the residents of the South Bay District supplied with water from The Sweetwater Water Corporation are compelled to go without water for hours at a time from time to time, and

WHEREAS, this situation is growing intolerable, and the City Officials of the City of Chula Vista are compelled to spend time listening to complaints of water users who have been compelled to go without water, and

WHEREAS, it appears that a storage tank would prevent the recurrence of such period of time without water,

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Chula Vista in regular meeting assembled, does hereby complain of such situation and does hereby make demand upon THE SWEETWATER WATER CORPORATION to install immediately a storage tank or other facilities to prevent the shutting of or ~~stopping~~ discontinuance of the flow of water to the residents of Chula Vista, and does further hereby make complaint to the Railroad Commission of the State of California and ask that it take action on its own initiative to remedy the said evil.
