

RESOLUTION No. 382

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF CHULA VISTA, CALIFORNIA, CANVASSING THE SPECIAL ELECTION HELD IN SAID CITY ON TUESDAY, THE 30th DAY OF OCTOBER, 1934, FOR THE PURPOSE OF VOTING UPON THE PROPOSITION OF INCURRING A BONDED INDEBTEDNESS BY SAID CITY FOR STREET IMPROVEMENT WORK.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Chula Vista, California, did at a regular meeting thereof held on the 2nd day of October, 1934, by a vote of more than two-thirds of all its members, duly and regularly pass and adopt Resolution No. 378 of said City determining and declaring that the public interest and necessity demanded the acquisition and construction of a certain municipal improvement; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Chula Vista did on the 16th day of October, 1934, at an adjourned regular meeting thereof, by a vote of more than two-thirds of all its members, duly and regularly pass and adopt Ordinance No. 236 of said City entitled "An Ordinance of the City of Chula Vista, California, ordering, calling and providing for the holding of a special election to be held in the City of Chula Vista on Tuesday, the 30th day of October, 1934, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of said City a proposition to incur a bonded indebtedness by said City for street improvement work"; and

WHEREAS, said Ordinance No. 236 was published once a week for two successive weeks in the "Chula Vista Star," a newspaper published less than six days a week within said City of Chula Vista, to-wit, on October 19th and October 26th, 1934; and

WHEREAS, it appears that notice of said election was duly and regularly given and that said election was duly and regularly held as required by law; and that in all respects said election was held and conducted, and the votes cast thereat received and canvassed and the returns thereof made and declared, in the time, form and manner as required by law; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Chula Vista has met at the Council Chambers of said City, in the City Hall, on Monday the 5th day of November, 1934, to canvass the returns of said election:

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Chula Vista does resolve, find, determine and declare as follows:

SECTION 1. That said special election was held and conducted in said City of Chula Vista on Tuesday the 30th day of October, 1934, in time, form and manner as required by law.

SECTION 2. That the proposition submitted at said election was as follows:

"Shall the City of Chula Vista incur a bonded indebtedness in the principal amount of \$107,000.00 for the acquisition and construction of a municipal improvement, to-wit, a system of street improvements by the acquisition, construction and installation of approximately 277,000 square yards of rock asphalt surfacing over existing granite base on various related streets of said city, including portions of substantially all major streets in the City of Chula Vista?"

SECTION 3. That there were two consolidated election precincts for said special election; that the total number of votes cast at said election was 1195; that the total number of votes cast for and against said proposition at each consolidated election precinct was as

follows:

That the total vote cast in favor of said proposition at said election was 984; that the total vote cast against said proposition at said election was 209.

SECTION 4. That the City Council of the City of Chula Vista does hereby find, determine and declare that more than two-thirds of the qualified voters voting on said proposition at said election voted in favor of said proposition as hereinbefore more fully stated, and that said proposition carried, and that the issuance of bonds in the principal amount of \$107,000.00, for the purposes stated in said proposition, is authorized.
