

RESOLUTION NO. 412
OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHULA VISTA, CALIFORNIA,
DIRECTING THE PUBLICATION OF NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS INVITING
SEALED PROPOSALS FOR PAVING AND OTHERWISE IMPROVING PORTIONS
OF CERTAIN STREETS IN THE CITY OF CHULA VISTA, CALIFORNIA.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHULA VISTA,
CALIFORNIA,

That there be published in "The Chula Vista Star", a newspaper of general circulation published in the City of Chula Vista, California, in the issue thereof of Friday, June 28, 1935, in the issue of Friday, July 5, 1935, and in the issue of July 12, 1935, a Notice to Contractors Inviting Sealed Proposals for furnishing all labor, material, transportation and services for paving and otherwise improving portions of certain streets in the City of Chula Vista, California, in accordance with plans and specifications prepared by Allen & Rowe, engineers for said City, now on file with the City Clerk of the City of Chula Vista, California, numbered 416, and commonly known as P.W.A. Docket 8025;

That such notice be also published in the "Southwest Builder and Contractor", a publication published at 158 South Hill Street, in the City of Los Angeles, California, and having some circulation among contractors, in not less than three (3) issues thereof, not less than four (4) days apart, and between June 28, 1935 and July 12, 1935, both days inclusive, as the City Clerk of the City of Chula Vista, California may arrange;

That said Notice to Contractors shall be in the following form,
to-wit:

Pursuant to law and to Resolution No. 412, directing this Notice adopted on the 25th day of June, 1935, by the City Council of the City of Chula Vista, California, and on file in the office of the City Clerk of said City:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City of Chula Vista, California, will receive sealed proposals for furnishing all labor, material, transportation and services for paving and otherwise improving portions of certain streets in said City, each bid to be in accordance with Plans and Specifications prepared by Allen and Rowe, Engineers for said City, now on file with the City Clerk of Chula Vista, California, and commonly known as P.W.A. Docket No. 8025.

Notice is also hereby given that all work done under the contract shall be in accord with the rules and regulations of the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works.

Notice is also hereby given bidders that pursuant to the provisions of General Laws of the State of California, the City of Chula Vista, California, has ascertained the general prevailing rate of per diem wages for each craft or type of workman or mechanic needed to execute the contract which will be awarded the successful bidder; and that these prevailing rates are contained in Resolution No. 407 adopted by the said City on June 3, 1935, and filed with the City Clerk of said City, and are as follows:

The foregoing schedule of prevailing rates of per diem wages is based upon a working day of eight (8) hours and in the event that laborers, workmen or mechanics are employed less than eight (8) hours per day, the per diem wages shall be deemed to be that fraction of the foregoing rates that the number of hours of employment bears to eight (8) hours.

Legal holiday and overtime general prevailing rate of wages on this project is one and one-half (1-1/2) the respective hourly rate aforesaid.

All skilled labor on this project shall receive not less than One and 10/100 Dollars (\$1.10) per hour, and all unskilled labor not less than the respective hourly rate ascertained herein.

Notice is also hereby given bidders that it shall be mandatory upon the contractor to whom the contract is awarded and upon all subcontractors under him, to pay not less than said general prevailing rates of per diem wages as set forth in said specifications and as above listed, to all laborers, workmen, and mechanics employed in the execution of the contract, and further, that in no event and regardless of the determination of the general prevailing rate of per diem wages as hereinabove set out, not less than the minimum wage rates prescribed by the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works must be paid on this project.

Notice is also hereby given that all bidders must submit with their bids, a sworn statement of their financial responsibility, technical ability and experience.

Each bid shall be made out on a form to be obtained from the office of Allen and Rowe, 309 G Street, San Diego, California, the Engineers for the City of Chula Vista, California; must be accompanied by a certified or cashier's check or bid bond for five percent (5%) of the amount of the bid made payable to the order of the City of Chula Vista, California; shall be sealed and filed with the City Clerk of said City any time up to the hour set for the opening of said bids; and said bids will be opened in public at 7:30 o'clock P.M. of that day in the Council Chamber of the City Hall of said City, to-wit, the 13th day of July, 1935.

The above mentioned check or bond shall be given as a guarantee that the bidder will enter into contract if awarded the work, and will be declared forfeited if the successful bidder refuses to enter into said contract after being requested so to do by the City of Chula Vista, California.

The successful bidder will be required to furnish a labor and material bond in an amount equal to 50% of the contract price, and a faithful performance bond in an amount equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the contract price; said bonds to be secured from a surety company satisfactory to the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works and to the City of Chula Vista, California. A list of such surety companies is on file with the City Clerk of said City.

The City of Chula Vista, California, reserves the right to reject any or all bids and/or to waive any irregularity in a bid.
